

- Help students understand the psychological challenges during the pandemic
- Identify effective coping strategies and explore ways to enhance their skills

Summary of the Session:

Dr. Jamila Koshy broadly classified her session into three parts, that is, global and national effects of the pandemic, individual effect from students' perspective and the effect on family. To help students understand the effect of the pandemic in their lives. She explained the stress response in humans. She stated that students are the 'mobile generation' they like to socialize and enjoy spending time with family and friends and prefer independence. The pandemic has restricted their movement, socialization, personal space, and independence. This has resulted in emotional distress - boredom, frustration, anger; physiological distress - inversion in sleep patterns, headache, and behavioral problems - pretense, escapist addiction, and isolation. Increasing our coping resources, having regular discussions with family members, and sharing responsibilities at home are the best ways to mitigate the impact of the pandemic and the subsequent lockdown. She motivated the students to initiate such healthy practices at home. The session was concluded by a Q & A session.





But Malala continued going to school. When she was 11 years old, she wrote a blog about the situation facing by the people and children of swat valley. Later, by activist Desmond tuto, she was nominated for International children's peace prize. 9 October 2012, on her way to home, she was shot by Taliban gunman (terrorist) on bus. She was hit in the head. For further treatment she was taken to UK, Elizabeth hospital. This new spread a spark around the world and many people came in support of Malala. She gave speech at the United nations, nine months after shot by the Taliban. After her recovery, Malala Yousafzai became a activist for right to education. Malala's aim is that every child should get their basic education. Malala Yousafzai became the youngest person to receive Nobel peace prize, along with Kailash Satyarthi, Indian children's right activist. She wrote a book 'I am Malala' that inspired many around the world. Although she still gets the death threats by Taliban, she is continuing her work for children and women to get proper education and their basic rights.





<u>Title-</u> 'Educating for Inequality: The Experiences of India's "Indigenous" Citizens'

Introduction— Nandini Sundar is professor of Sociology at DU and co-editor of Contributions to Indian Sociology. 'Educating for Inequality: The Experiences of India's "Indigenous" Citizens' is one of her important contributions to sociology, particularly anthropology. With the help of this research, she has dug deeper into the relation between indigenous knowledge and formal education. It specifically deals with the conflicts and problems concerning education faced by the indigenous people or adivasis. The report has been a success after nineteen years (1990–2009) of observation of schools in Bastar (Chhattisgarh) and more specific research on schools in Jashpur (Chhattisgarh, 2001-2002) apart from analysis of writings by other scholars on adivasi schooling in central India (Orissa or Andhra Pradesh).

Discussion— To throw some light on the backward status of the adivasis, Sundar has compared their conditions with that of the scheduled castes. She says that literacy rates among the former are very low, for their primary concern has been control over natural resources unlike latter who fight for upward mobility within the caste system. Whereas dalits are inspired by Dr. B. R. Ambedkar, adivasis lack a role model in education. Moreover, adivasis face a problem of language. Not only is there a language gap between students and teachers who do not speak any of the local languages, but these students are also ill-treated. Children are in fact punished for talking in their native language and such problems destroy the child's self-esteem. In classroom interactions too, non-adivasi children, though minority, dominate by virtue of their greater social confidence. There is practically no education in majorly spoken adivasi languages like Bhili, Gondi or Oraon. Although the Indian states were initially organized on linguistic grounds, not a single state was formed for adivasis. Adivasi children are also denied their own culture and history as the curriculum is usually based on the experiences of urban middle-class Indian children.

According to the report, Catholic Church and RSS play a major role in increasing the class and sectarian differences in society. In RSS organizations like the Vanvasi Kalyan Ashram, they make an attempt to turn adivasi children into Hindus, especially in hostels where children are trained to hold bhajan mandalis. Though the introduction of standardized schooling systems has resulted in the recognition of what is called indigenous knowledge, it has also lead to certain loss of the same. Construction of dams and industries, deforestation and degradation of natural resources force them into displacement which ultimately reduces the habitat in which indigenous knowledge survives.

Reasons behind low literacy among Adivasis are the absence of primary schools in local areas, teacher absenteeism, poor infrastructure, poor hygiene, lack of furniture, blackboards and books. Poverty responsible for hunger, malnutrition and ill-health, is the major cause for low attendance. This is the scenario despite a number of schemes provided by governments for adivasi children, such as stipends, a book bank scheme, special coaching for entry into

engineering and medical college, and the construction of hostels because parents believe that cost of sending children to school and the poor quality of education are not worth their expense.

On the brighter side, a large literature in languages like Bodo and Santhali has emerged. Music videos and low-budget films have led to a proliferation of media in adivasi languages like Nagpuri, Santhali, Mundari, and Halbi.

Conclusion-

This report was an effort to problematize the effects of formal education in terms of adivasi identity and future citizenship. Adivasis are excluded from full-fledged citizenship rights by denial of minimum education. Their lands are easily acquired, and they are often exploited by traders and moneylenders. They are unable to document their problems, participate in politics or even stand for themselves. Since education is their only option for advancement, adivasis have always been more interested in education than non-adivasis but did not send their children to school either because of poverty or inferiority. Also, children would lose connection with the world of labour and their capacity to engage in agriculture. So while education was seen as essential in enabling adivasis to avoid exploitation, it was also felt that too much literary education would alienate adivasi children from their own culture.

Organizations like the Ramakrishna Mission or the Mata Rukmini Devi Sansthan are encouraged by the government to work in adivasi areas. Advocates in this field argue that it is possible to combine formal schooling with a concern for the preservation of indigenous knowledge. Dhumkuria school (Bihar) is one such attempt where children were taught both local crafts and prepared for state board exams. Lastly, Sundar says, "the model for adivasi schooling that we should aspire to is one where children are enabled both to compete on equal terms in the world of formal employment and not just at the lowest levels as the government idea of "mainstreaming" suggests, as well as to affirm their adivasi culture, languages and knowledge."
